Come join us for an afternoon of gleaning, sorting and bagging produce at the DC area's largest produce supplier to food banks!

The Mid-Atlantic Gleaning Network (MAGNET) is based in Alexandria, Virginia, with satellite offices in Maryland. The Gleaning Network links farmers who have edible crops with those who distribute food to the needy through the work of volunteer gleaners. Their staff organizes teams of people to go to local farms to harvest fresh fruits and vegetables to be given to low income individuals, families, as well as agencies or communities that serve the hungry. MAGNET is the main produce supplier for frequent CCW partner, AFAC.

This event is family friendly! Please remember to bring your coats because some of the day's tasks will include gleaning produce outdoors. Other tasks include sorting and bagging produce, and other light manual labor. The venue can accommodate up to 40 volunteers.



CCW's new website went live in December Have you logged in yet?

- ♦ CCW transitioned to a new website last month. Though the address remains the same (www.cornellclubdc.org), the new system unifies CCW's database with the website for the first time.
- ♦ Here's where you come in: Site administrators should have sent you a message at the email address we have on file for you, inviting you to log in for the first time. When you do, you'll be asked to create a password. From then on, you'll be able to see and correct your membership information, and the site will remember it for event registrations and similar functions. The site will not store payment or credit card data.
- ♦ If you didn't receive that email, please check your Spam or Trash folder, just in case. If it's not there, then kindly contact one of the admin team below and give us your name and the email address you'd like to use. We can then go into the system and set you up with the right email address so you can start the process. You won't need to log into the site to use it for things like reading news and information. Restaurant Series - Mala Tang

Washingtonian Magazine listed Mala Tang as one of the "on the rise" restaurants in its Top 100 listing in 2012. For its ongoing Restaurant Series, CCW has selected Mala Tang as the venue for its next foodie outing.

From the review: Szechuan isn't a cuisine for the faint of sensibility—it's a triple-barreled assault of smoke, heat and pungency that excites and numbs the palate. Chef Liu Chaosheng retains all those properties at this East/West mash-up but also brings finesse to his small plates—the best reasons to pay a visit.

The ruby-walled room, with its turned-down lighting and low-key techno soundtrack, feels like the sort of place where drinks are king and food is an afterthought. But few Asian restaurants are as mindful of the details. Hot pot is the focus, and to appeal to Western palates, diners are encouraged to order their own pot—it's customary to share—and accent it with fish, meat, and veggies.

What to get: Hot pot with pork, prawns, green-bean leaves, and wood-ear mushrooms; wood-ear mushrooms with chili oil and cilantro; pork dumplings; dan-dan noodles; scallion pancake.

The Cornell Club of Washington is once again organizing a group tour of the Diplomatic Reception Rooms on the eighth floor of the Department of State after a lapse of several years. This tour is strictly limited to 25 participants, so sign up early. CCW must submit participants' names to the Department by February 5th.

The Diplomatic Reception Rooms are among the most beautiful rooms in the world used for official entertaining. In this setting, the Secretary of State, the Vice President and members of the Cabinet entertain leaders of the world as well as foreign and American dignitaries. These spaces house a premier collection of early American paintings, furniture and decorative arts, dating from 1740 until the late 19th century. Curator Marcee Craighill has made some significant changes and the tour now gives greater emphasis to the roles these important furnishings have played in U.S. diplomatic history.

CCW group tours have become a mini-tradition ever since then-Secretary of State William P. Rogers (1969-73) and his wife Adele — both distinguished Cornellians — first invited our club to tour the 8th floor.

The National Academy of Sciences, located directly across the street, has an excellent cafeteria where those of us who want to have lunch together can meet prior to our tour at State. A brief look at the academy's headquarters building and its Great Hall is also being arranged.
