

The Virginia Gold Cup is hav-

ing its 88th running on May 4th. Join recent graduates from MIT, The Seven Sisters, The Ivy League, University of Chicago and Johns Hopkins at the 15th annual University Row celebration.

Yes, there are horse races too, even betting for the first time.

The Virginia Gold Cup is a grand spring tradition. Run in Fauguier County since 1922 and attended by more than 50,000 spectators, this race is one of the largest, most popular sporting events in the greater Washington metro area. Race day features six hurdle and timber horses races, Jack Russell Terrier races, tent, tailgate and hat contests, and vendor booths for shopping.

The first bus leaves from Ballston Mall around 9:30am and successive buses will continue to leave every few minutes until around 11am. A mainstay of Cornell's presence in the nation's capital is the Washington Men's Camerata, which has been keeping the tradition of male choruses thriving in the area for 29 years.

In 1984, five young attorneys at a D.C. law firm discovered that they had all sung in glee clubs and missed making music. Some of them joined an existing mixed chorus on Capitol Hill but really wanted to be part of a men's chorus.

Brad Spencer, a 1979 Cornell grad, and Audi Peale of Harvard were the prime organizers of the Camerata in 1984. In the ensuing years, they recruited fellow alumni, and at one point 13 Cornell alums sang with the chorus. Singing with the Camerata now are Scott Spencer '71, Ned Goldberg '75, Bob Harris '80, Bob McKinless '48 and Brad Spencer, a long-time member of the Cornell Glee Club's Advisory Board.

You can see your fellow alums and the rest of the Camerata on Sunday, June 2nd, at 7:30 pm at the Kennedy Center Terrace Theater. Directed by Frank Albinder, the chorus will sing "The Great American Songbook," which will include music by Gershwin, Rodgers, Kern, Porter and more, with special guests soprano Rosa Lamoreaux and the Rock Creek Singers.
