An Afternoon with Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg

Over one hundred members of the Cornell Club of Washington gathered in the East Conference Room of the Supreme Court on Thursday afternoon, September 12, 2013 to visit with Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg '54. Justice Ginsburg spoke briefly about the Chief Justices whose portraits lined the walls of the elegant room and then opened the floor to questions, which began with the advice Justice Ginsburg's mother-in-law gave her on her wedding day ("Sometimes it's good to be deaf") and ended with her advice for gay couples, such as the one whose wedding she recently officiated at ("Same as my mother-in-law's to me"). She spoke candidly and thoughtfully about her studies at Cornell, Harvard and Columbia, her legal career and the obstacles facing women in the law during that time. After the talk, she chatted with Susan Werner's father, who sat next to the Justice in a Harvard Law School Class and Linda Goldfarb Roberts '62, whose father was the plaintiff in the 1976, case Califano v. Goldfarb, which the Justice argued before the Supreme Court. The Court decided 5-4 for Goldfarb that gender roles were not sufficient to justify the different treatment of widows and widowers in awarding Social Security survivor's benefits. She then posed for a photo with current members of the CCW Board of Directors.
