Tour of Gettysburg Battlefield

As the mist lifted over the Gettysburg field of battle on Sunday morning, October 20th, 54 hardy souls from Cornell and Columbia dismounted from their chartered bus to walk where those brave soldiers did 150 years ago. Led by military historian and Cornell professor, David Silbey, the group started at the north end of the battlefield and climbed two towers to get the lay of the land as it was in those first three days of July, 1863. They then moved on to Devil's Den and Little Round Top. After a delicious lunch at General Pickett's Buffet, the tour resumed at the Virginia Memorial on the Confederate side where a group picture was taken. Then it was off to the site of Pickett's ill-fated Charge, walking the undulating ground to fully appreciate the futility of this plan of attack against the Union forces on the higher ground. After a brief stop at the Visitors Center, the group visited the National Cemetery where soldiers from both sides were buried. The day's mission ended with a sunset bus ride back to Washington.
