Featuring Keynote Speaker Cornell President Emeritus Hunter R. Rawlings III

May 21st, 6:30 - 10PM

Enjoy an excellent meal and conversation with fellow Cornellians at our Annual Dinner. We are honored to be joined by the evening's keynote speaker, Hunter R. Rawlings III, president of the Association of American Universities and Cornell's tenth president.

Hunter Rawlings served as Cornell's president from 1995 to 2003. During his tenure, he promoted increasing the number of undergraduate applications for admission, lowered the university's rate of offers of admission, and raised the yield rate on those offers. He also permanently established Cornell's needblind admission policy and also launched the Residential Initiative for Cornell's undergraduates - which resulted in North Campus's transformation into a living and learning community for freshmen and also revamped West Campus as a hub of residential colleges for upperclassmen.

At the conclusion of his presidency in 2003, Rawlings was elected president emeritus and began serving as a full-time professor in Cornell's Departments of Classics and History. He became president of the Association of American Universities on June 1, 2011.

Prior to being inaugurated as Cornell's tenth president, Rawlings served as president of the University of Iowa from 1988 to 1995. Before his tenure in Iowa, he spent 18 years at the University of Colorado at Boulder, where he served as faculty member, chairman of the Classics Department, associate vice chancellor for instruction, and then vice president for academic affairs for the University of Colorado system. A native Virginian, Rawlings received his doctorate in classics from Princeton University in 1970 and graduated from Haverford College with honors in classics in 1966.

During this special evening, CCW President A'ndrea Van Schoick will preside over the club's annual business meeting, including the annual report, presentation of the Bondareff and Best Program awards, and election of board members.
