Help Cornell alumni staff and spend a morning volunteering at the Washington Animal Rescue League (WARL), a great place for rescued pets and loving animals in need of homes! As part of our sesquicentennial celebrations, CCW is asking the Washington DC region Cornellians to represent their dedication to the "service" portion of our university's scholarship, service, and work credo.

Overview: Up to 50 volunteers will assist WARL with cleaning, mulching, and other light labor at their facility in NW DC. Volunteers must be 18 years or older (or ages 12-17 if accompanied by parents), and should wear closed-toe shoes.

The event will begin with a talk by Michael I. Kotlikoff, VMD, PhD, the Austin O. Hooey Dean of the College of Veterinary Medicine at Cornell University, followed by service work in several breakout groups, and finishing with a dog training demonstration. Coffee and snacks will be provided. Volunteers will have the opportunity to interact with pets at the facility at the end of our work session!

Please consider bringing a donation to WARL's Food Bank. Supported entirely by private donations, the Rescuers' Food Bank collects donations of food, toys, and supplies for cats and dogs and distributes them to income-qualified clients free of charge. The food bank has become a critical lifeline for many people and animals in the area, serving more than 100 families on a monthly basis.

Items needed: Dry dog or cat food in unopened bags; Wet dog or cat food in cans; Dog and cat toys; Basic supplies such as cat litter, beds, dog leashes, etc.

Climate Change and Agriculture: Just how secure is our food supply?

November 10th, 6:30-9:00PM

American Institutes for Research, 1000 Thomas Jefferson St, NW

Please join us for this exciting presentation by Director and Associate Dean Michael P. Hoffmann, who will describe the changes that are occurring due to human-caused climate change and examples of what Cornell is doing to help ensure food security into the future

Agriculture is no longer business as usual. The climate is changing - it is getting warmer, and the evidence is all around us. Springs are arriving earlier, summers are hotter and winters are warmer. Consistent with a warmer and moister atmosphere, we are also observing more severe weather and shifts in precipitation patterns. The decade 2001-2010 was the hottest recorded ever, and the trajectory is set for the average global temperature to continue to warm into the future - as much as 8° F by 2100 with smaller increases near the equator and greater at the poles. The anticipated increases in temperature along with changes in precipitation patterns and greater variability in the weather have profound implications for agriculture and the security of our food supply.
