Ezra Cornell Tour Set for DC Area on September 20th

For the first time ever, the Cornell Club of Washington has organized a tour featuring Ezra Cornell's little-known, life-changing years in the nation's capital. Join fellow alumni and friends for a unique adventure tracing Cornell's footsteps in DC before he founded our university.


Registration for this unprecedented program, "Preparing for the Sesquicentennial: Tour of Ezra Cornell's Achievements in Washington and Vicinity 1843-1844," is now open to members of the Cornell Club of Washington. Sign up now! This bus tour will be fully booked soon.

What: Day-long bus tour from downtown DC and Capitol Hill to College Park along a major segment of the original Washington-Baltimore telegraph line built by Ezra Cornell.

When: Saturday, September 20, 2014, 8:15 AM until about 4:30 PM.

Where: Meet at the Hotel Monaco, F Street NW, between 7th and 8th Streets (Gallery Place Metro).

Why: CCW's kick-off to Cornell's 150th anniversary celebrations and a fascinating exposure to Ezra's new venture as an entrepreneur.



Completed in 1840 as the General Post Office for the nation's capital, the Hotel Monaco's historic building originally housed the first Telegraph Office in the United States. Coffee, tea and pastries will be served together with an expert briefing to launch the tour. Immediately across the street is the original U.S. Patent Office where Ezra obtained his patent for a telegraph-laying plow and frequented the Patent Office library.

Like a time machine, our bus will visit sites known to Ezra when he lived and worked here building the experimental telegraph line from Washington to Baltimore. Meet influential leaders in his circle of contacts who contributed significantly to his work and scientific research and technology in mid-19th century America.

Experience vicariously the intellectual ferment of Ezra's times. Various experts are expected to provide special briefings at some stops on the itinerary. Tour culminates at the Maryland Agricultural College founded in 1856 (now the University of Maryland) with a spotlight on mid-19th century reforms in agricultural education and research.

It all adds up to a prequel to the yet-to-be enacted Morrill Land Grant Act of 1862 and the subsequent founding of Cornell University in 1865.

Metro: Foggy Bottom (Orange/Blue)

Transportation/Directions: Thompson Boat Center is located at the intersection of Rock Creek Parkway and Virginia Ave on the edge of Georgetown, on the Rock Creek Parkway bicycle path. Thompson's is about 6 blocks west of the Foggy Bottom-GWU Metro, or about 3 blocks south of M Street Circulator and Metrobus stops.

Cost/RSVP: You must bring a credit card to rent a boat. The credit card serves as a deposit. Afterward, you may pay via credit card or cash. Canoe rental is \$35 (2 or 3 people), single kayak is \$35 (1 person), and double kayak is \$45 (2 people), paid at TBC. TBC does not take reservations, so we may not be able to guarantee you get your preferred kind of boat.

At a recent Board meeting, the Cornell Club of Washington voted to donate \$2,000 to the Cornell Outdoor Education program (COE) in memory of my husband, **Ed Berkowitz '56**.

This generous contribution connects and highlights two of Ed's greatest loves, Cornell and the outdoors. From his earliest Boy Scout days, Ed was an avid hiker and camper, an interest that remained with him throughout his life, often relieving the stress of being a Washington lawyer. An equally avid Cornell alum, he joined CCW soon after we moved to DC and served as an active Board member for many, many years, both before and after his term as CCW President (1969-71). The club's Old Rag hikes were highlights of each year for him. At the same time he engaged our family in rafting, tent camping and backpacking.

Bridging his interests, Ed was a long time member of COE's Advisory Board, working to help COE provide Cornell students with the finest possible outdoor experiences and leadership training. Advisory Board members also did adventure travel. Ed and I enjoyed glacier climbing in Alaska, shark diving in South Africa and cave canoeing in Thailand.

COE's programs are known to be some of the best in the country in terms of scope and safety records. They serve not only undergraduates, but also local business people who want to promote teamwork and alumni who love the outdoors.

My family and I are extremely grateful to CCW for remembering Ed in this very special way. I hope the gift will help local Cornellians become more familiar with COE's fine programs and grow their sense of adventure.
