Brann Speaks on Middle East Conflict and Peace

Thursday, April 22, 7:00 p.m. Regional Food & Drink, 810 7th Street, NW

You are cordially invited to hear Professor Ross Brann, Milton R. Konvitz Professor of Judeo-Islamic Studies and Chairman of the Department of Near Eastern Studies at Cornell University, speak on "Road Map to Middle East Conflict and Peace: A Historical Perspective" on Thursday, April 22.

Professor Brann will discuss the significance and unanticipated consequences of the events of 1967 and how they dominate the current state of the conflict between Israelis and Palestinians. He will also discuss recent and current efforts at peacemaking, including the American role. Finally, he will also speak about how these issues have been addressed on the Cornell campus. Suggested reading for this lecture: David Shipler's *Arab and Jew: Wounded Spirits in a Promised Land.*

Ross Brann is serving his fourth term as Chair of the Department of Near Eastern Studies at Cornell University. A native of San Francisco, California, he graduated Phi Beta Kappa from the University of California at Berkeley and received his Ph.D. from New York University. A Guggenheim and NEH Fellow, Brann is the author of *The Compunctious Poet: Cultural Ambiguity and Hebrew Poetry in Muslim Spain* (Johns Hopkins U Press), recipient of the 1992 National Jewish Book Award in Sephardic Studies, and author of *Power in the Portrayal: Representations of Muslims and Jews in Islamic Spain* (Princeton UP, 2002).

On campus, Brann has been especially active in promoting dialogue groups between Muslim, Arab and Jewish students on various educational programs around conflict resolution in the Middle East for the Ithaca community in general and the Ithaca public schools in particular.

Additional paddlers are still needed for our two boatloads of 20 paddlers each. We may also enter a third boat in the new 12-paddler events added to this year's racing program. These exciting new 12-paddler boats are scheduled to arrive from Taiwan in late April.

First Practice: Our unique, spirited and altogether fun team needs to submit its roster, including a team photo for the Festival Program Booklet. We're now planning our first training session with photos for Sunday after-

noon, April 24--probably starting at 3:00 p.m. Those who can stay on for an impromptu picnic should mark their calendars accordingly.

Location and Dates: Like the Festival itself--to be held the weekend of May 22-23--this will be a rain or shine event. There will be only three training sessions--all at the new Anacostia Community Boathouse, located at 1115 "O" Street, SE, adjacent to the Washington Navy Yard's "O"-Street Gate. Dates for two remaining practices--in May--will be set by the team members themselves.

Since AAP and Hotel conduct interviews outside of the CAAAN system, we targeted the 260 students in the five remaining schools for contact by an alum and submitted contact reports for 218 or 84%. This included seven come-from-behind wins, capped by a late season rally from an 11-2 deficit against top-10 ranked Virginia while playing one person short and with two women hurt during the game.

In the season-ending tournament, where every team brings just their best, Cornell made the Elite Eight, after a stirring comeback from a 10-0 deficit against an un-friendly Texas squad out for revenge, before falling to two-time defending champ Penn State, who also inflicted the only regular season loss (10-9).

Though serious sports were played at times, there were light games, a weekend post-game barbeque, after-games league gatherings at the Bottom Line, CCSP and other watering holes, and good people (some on the other teams too).

While many veterans (of various generations) return, there are a few gaping holes from departures through relocations and weddings (combined) of long-time stalwarts who helped carry Cornell from the initial depths of those early seasons to last year's heights. Thanks to Blair DeSio and Laura Yancer (who at least kept it in the team by marrying each other) and Audrey Kleinsmith, Board Member, Cornell CAN rep, longtime softball GM, first regular women pitcher in CAN, and the reason most of us were here in the first place.

Special needs include female athletes (our top two moved away and we need more regulars), anyone who can play multiple positions, young legs especially on defense, a little extra power, role players, someone (Laura-like) to be push when we fail to pay attention or care, during the game cheerers and after games pros, and people who know and do what it takes to be part of a good team and have fun too. Today, Anderson House serves as the headquarters and meeting place for the Society of Cincinnati, the first veteran's organization established in the United States--with George Washington as its first president-- and the oldest patriotic-lineal society in the world.
