Hillary Corsun '06 Solar House Wins 2nd Place in **Deptartment of Energy Competition**

WASHINGTON. October 7-14 — After two years of design work, eight months of construction, and three weeks of moving and last minute preparation, the Cornell Solar Decathlon (CUSD) team earned second place in the Department of Energy's Solar Decathlon competition in Washington, D.C.



From October 7-14, the homes were judged in 10 different areas, earning points throughout the week. The Cornell team came in second in the Getting Around Contest where each school earned points based on how many miles they could drive their electric cars. The team also earned second in the Appliances Contest; each team had to maintain a certain refrigerator/freezer temperature, wash and dry clothes, cook meals, run the dishwasher, and run a television and computer. Cornell won the Comfort Zone Contest by keeping the home within the narrow, preferred range of temperature, humidity, and air quality and also took first in the Hot Water Contest. The team tied for third in the Architecture Contest earning 188 of 200 points. While the judging was going on, the team was also giving tours to the public. Despite pouring rain and cloudy days, well over 1,000 people passed through the house every day.

The Cornell team gained support from across campus with large donations from the colleges of Engineering, Architecture, Art and Planning, Agriculture and Life Sciences and the Johnson Graduate School of Management. Individuals, non-profit organizations and corporations also supported the team through both monetary and product donations as well as by lending their expertise. 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Roving Reporter: Gladys Stifel '58 CCW at the U.S. Botanic Garden Conservatory

WASHINGTON, September 27 — The CCW enjoyed a wonderful tropical evening at the totally renovated US Botanic Garden Conservatory. Nearly 3 years after CCW's first attempt to schedule and partake of such an event, CCW perservered, and more than 100 Cornellians of varying ages came to enjoy the well-attended event. It was quite a few years ago when the CCW last had an event at the USBG.

Don Rakow, Director of Cornell Plantations, spoke to the assembled group about Cornell Plantations and the USBG. Accompanying him and also speaking were 3 Cornell-educated students, whose work was and is in horticulture and public garden management. Docent-led tours were enjoyed by many of the alumni present.

Welcomed by the Director of the USBG, Holly Shimizu, the long awaited evening was worth the wait. Current Chair Charles Schilke also spoke, and gave credits where due, most especially to the Cornell Federation which awarded CCW a grant to underwrite the event. CCW was sponsored by Congressman Walsh of Syracuse, NY, father of a Cornell graduate. Carolyn DeWilde Caswell '90, Senior Associate Director from the Middle Atlantic States Regional Office for Cornell also gave words of welcome and highlighted coming events of CCW.

Not mentioned was an important CCW former member, the late Robert L. Hansen (Grad '66 Ag Eng) who was the Executive Director of the National Fund for the US Botanic Garden for 8 years (1995-2003) until his death in 2003. He also laid the groundwork for a successful National Garden (a part of the USBG, and scheduled to be completed in March 2006), currently under construction adjacent to the US Botanic Conservatory. Bob Hansen brought in key Founding Sponsors. In 1997; he ran a commemorative coin program, creating a USBG coin with the US Mint, which raised more than \$3 million, which greatly helped in facilitating the reconstruction of the U.S. Botanic Garden, which occurred from late 1997 until its completion and reopening in December 2001.
