Cornell Names 12th President

On Saturday, January 21, Cornell's Board of Trustees approved the appointment of Dr. David J. Skorton, president of the University of Iowa, as the next president of Cornell University. Dr. Skorton is an eminent physician, scholar and seasoned academic leader, who served for more than twenty years in a variety of faculty and executive positions at the University of Iowa before becoming president in March 2003. Dr. Skorton was selected from a number of outstanding candidates after an extensive search and consultation with all segments of the Cornell community and educational leaders around the world. Dr. Skorton will assume his responsibilities as Cornell's 12th president on July 1, 2006. Hunter R. Rawlings will continue to serve as interim president until that date.

The Cornell Club of Washington congratulates Dr. Skorton on his appointment, and very much looks forward to welcoming him to DC in the hopefully not-to-distant future. We also wish to recognize CCW life member and trustee Diana Daniels for her hard work and commitment as the Chair of the Presidential Search Committee, and offer Diana our hearty congratulations on a job well done.

This is the first in a series of distinguished alumni speaking engagements. Judge Friedman was appointed United States District Judge in August 1994. He graduated from Cornell University in 1965 and received a J.D. from the School of Law of the State University of New York at Buffalo in 1968.

Following law school, Judge Friedman clerked for Judge Aubrey E. Robinson, Jr., of the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia and for Judge Roger Robb of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit. He served as an Assistant United States Attorney for the District of Columbia from 1970 to 1974, and as an Assistant to the Solicitor General of the United States from 1974 to 1976.
