Roving Reporter: Eliot Greenwald '73 Distinguished Cornellians Series: Jeffrey Lehman '77

WASHINGTON, March 21, 2006 Cornellians from the Cornell Club of Washington, the Cornell Black Alumni Association and the Cornell Latino Alumni Association gathered to hear former Cornell President Jeffrey Lehman speak about Grutter v. Bollinger, the Supreme Court case holding that the University of Michigan Law School may include racial diversity among its various criteria for admissions. President Lehman traced the history of university affirmative action back to the Supreme Court's Bakke decision in the late 1970s, when he was a law student at the University of Michigan. The Powell decision explained that racial classifications are inherently suspect and are subject to strict scrutiny by a reviewing court. However, when the use of race promotes a compelling governmental interest and is narrowly tailored to that interest its use is permissible. A racially and ethnically diverse student body was found to be such a compelling interest.

President Lehman explained that the majority opinion in Grutter, written by Justice O'Conner, specifically endorsed Justice Powell's Bakke opinion finding that student body diversity is a compelling interest. The Court's opinion also endorsed the Michigan Law School policy of achieving a "critical mass" level of integration that breaks down stereotypes and promotes cross-racial understanding. In doing so, the Court differentiated premissible goals from impermissible quotas. Justice O'Conner's opinion also recognized that is has been 25 years since the Bakke decision and suggested that in another 25 years, the use of racial preferences would no longer be necessary to further the interests approved in the opinion.

A lively question and answer period followed, in which President Lehman responded to numerous questions concerning the Grutter decision and the benefits that students obtain from a racially and culturally diverse student body. The Cornell Club of Washington was pleased to have the Cornell Black Alumni Association and the Cornell Latino Alumni Association as co-sponsors of the event. The opportunity for members of the three alumni organizations to interact with each other during the reception afterwards was itself a tribute to the benefits of a diverse student body.
