Clowns Do Cry: A Lifetime of Laughter and Tears Judy Gleklen Kopff '68

This is the third in a series of lectures in 2006 by distinguished Cornell alumni in the DC metropolitan area. Judy Kopff has volunteered in one way or another all her life. In addition to a full career of more than 30 years with the Federal Government (Department of Housing and Urban Development, U.S. Government Accountability Office, and the U.S. Department of Defense), Judy entertains children and adults alike with her humor, smiles, and -- more recently -- her balloon creations.



Vietnam - In 1999 she traveled on her own to

orphanages, schools, and hospitals, where she was usually the first and only American who had ever entertained the children.

Elián González – In 2000, she and her husband hosted a party at their home in the Cleveland Park neighborhood of Washington, where she taught this famous six-year old Cuban and his friends how to make balloon hats.

North Pole, Mongolia, Masai Mara (Kenya), Botswana, Indonesia, Egypt - "Clown Judy" fashioned balloon creations for children and "children at heart" over the past decade on her vacations throughout the world.

Judy was the 2005 winner of the Cornell Club of Washington's Bondareff Award for outstanding, significant, and continuous service to the Club for chairing for more than 30 years the Cornell Alumni Admissions Ambassador Network (CAAAN) #419, a committee of over 80 alumni responsible for contacting and meeting with applicants to Cornell from Washington, D.C. public and private schools.

Casey Tree Planting in Crispus Attucks Park

Big Red Dragons Host Cornell in Washington Students

ANACOSTIA RIVER, October 22 -- In a pioneering first, members of CCW's Dragon Boat Team, the "Big Red Dragons", hosted an introduction to Chinese dragonboat racing for aboit a dozen undergrads from the Cornell in Washington Program's fall semester. Most students who accepted the invitation to "Dragonboating 101" and a picnic afterward at the Anacostia Community Boathouse, are majoring in China Asia Pacific Studies (CAPS). The camaraderie was great, and the students will be able to draw on this experience when they arrive in Beijing in the Fall of 2007 for their semester of study in China.

Our coaches from the world-class D.C. Dragons, including Patti Jette Handley '94, were impressed with the quick-learning by the novices and their teamwork, as well as their highly respectable racing time over the 500-meter race course. For the students this was the first of what we hope will be many, many enjoyable and rewarding experiences in dragonboating.

For the Club's Big Red Dragons and their leaders this was clearly an event worth repeating in the Fall of 2007, when the second contingent of CAPS majors arrives in Washington for their semester in the Cornell in Washington Program. Between now and then there will be another Dragon Boat Festival on the Potomac on May 19-20, when the Cornell Club will enter its Big Red Dragons for the 5th year in a row. CCW members can mark their calendars now, and those interested in joining the team should watch for the signups early in the Spring.


