Celebrating Black History Month, we start with a one-hour tour of a highly acclaimed special exhibit featuring highlights from the huge collection amassed in Africa by the Tishman Family, admired and purchased by Walt Disney, and subsequently donated by the Walt Disney World Company to the museum in 2005, for all of us to enjoy. We will see 88 selected objects from Africa – magnificent examples of classic forms that inspired Picasso and other European artists.

Celebrating the reopening of the National Museum of American History, we'll take a short 8-minute stroll across the Mall and lunch together at the History Museum's totally new Stars and Stripes Cafe. Our group, possibly numbering 30-40 (or more), will be able to sit together and select from a full menu ranging from a large salad bar and vegetarian entrees through full meals and desserts.

Celebrating Abraham Lincoln's 200th Birthday (born February 12, 1809), those who still have time after lunch will want to check out the National Museum of American History's two new Lincoln exhibits opening on January 16th.
