Cornell Trees Find New Life on the National Mall

The new People's Garden on the National Mall in Washington, D.C., is now home to two new benches fashioned from a pair of sugar maples that were uprooted from the Cornell Campus in Ithaca to make way for construction. The 80-year-old trees stood outside Martha Van Rensselaer Hall. Now the new VanRose benches, named for founding codirectors of the College of Human Ecology, Martha Van Rensselaer and Flora Rose, were dedicated on April 22 in celebration of Earth Day. The People's Garden is located at the United States Department of Agriculture's Whitten Building.
