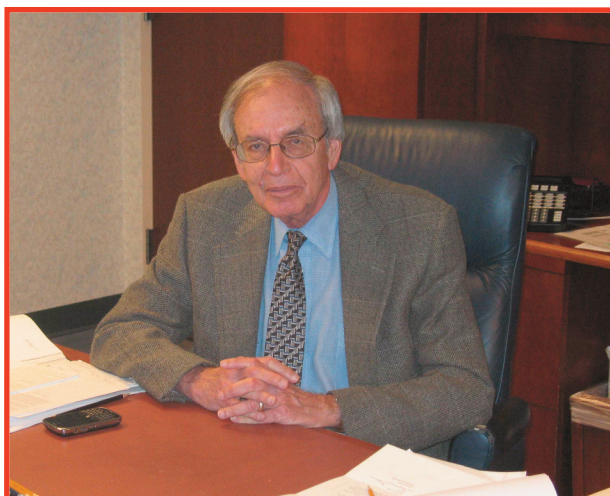
CCW Annual Dinner

Keynote Speaker, George Cohen '55, LLB '57
Director, Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service

From the NFL to educational reform, management versus labor issues affect our everyday lives. George Cohen is at the forefront of these issues, one day partnering with the Secretary of Education and major organizations representing public school teachers, administrators and boards; the next day mediating the NFL contract dispute.

George, a lively and engaging speaker, will provide insights from his distinguished career, which includes arguing five cases before the U.S. Supreme Court, involvement in the Major League Baseball strike of 1994-95, representation of the Directors Guild and the Screen Actors Guild and 40 years with Bredhoff and Kaiser, a Washington firm that specializes in labor and constitutional law. He is a 1955 and 1957 graduate of Cornell and the Law School, respectively, and he received an LLM from Georgetown University. He may even share stories about his Oscar-winning producer son.

NOTE: The picnic is on the last day of the US Open at Congressional Country Club. Please allow additional time for traffic or consider using the alternative route below.

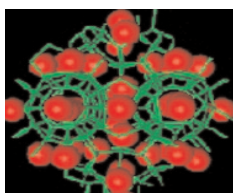
Alternative Directions:

Meet Our Genius: Prof. Michal Lipson

Michal Lipson, an associate professor of electrical and computer engineering at Cornell who received all three higher education degrees at the Technion-Israel Institute of Technology in Haifa, Israel, was named a MacArthur Foundation Fellow. One of 23 recipients selected for the so-called Genius Award in 2010, Prof. Lipson will receive a \$500,000 grant over five years.

Lipson is a pioneer in nanoscale photonics, developing photonic circuits in which beams of light flit through tiny waveguides on a silicon chip to replace electric circuits. She will tell us in nontechnical language what she hopes to achieve, and how it will change—and improve—the ways we can get and use information.
