Meet Our Genius: Prof. Michal Lipson



Michal Lipson, an associate professor of electrical and computer engineering at Cornell who received all three higher education degrees at the Technion-Israel Institute of Technology in Haifa, Israel, was named a MacArthur Foundation Fellow. One of 23 recipients selected for the so-called Genius Award in 2010, Prof. Lipson will receive a \$500,000 grant over five years.

Lipson is a pioneer in nanoscale photonics, developing photonic circuits in which beams of light flit through tiny waveguides on a silicon chip to replace electric circuits. She will tell us in nontechnical language what she hopes to achieve, and how it will change—and improve—the ways we can get and use information.

The Cornell Club of Washington is arranging for a family-friendly afternoon of programs, unlimited rides and special features at the newly relocated National Capital Trolley Museum. This event, to be held on September 10th, promises to be a great one to help launch the Cornell Club's 2011-2012 programming year and the new school year. So mark your calendars now and plan to attend.

To add a special Cornell and Ithaca spin to this event, we are working with various trolley and silent movie experts at the university and Tompkins County libraries to obtain film clips to complement the museum's own showings.

Enjoy 2-mile rides on a vintage streetcar through Northwest Branch Park. See "Streetcars Go To The Movies," starring Harold Lloyd, and take in the permanent exhibits in the Main Hall. Tour both American streetcars and European trams with a docent in Streetcar Hall. In the museum auditorium, enjoy "Trolley by Golly" a 12-minute film tracing the impact of streetcars on urban life and the rapid growth of cities in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. This is the film that inspired us to go after comparable trolley footage from the early years of Ithaca-made movies.

So come join us on the trolley and in the Cornell Club's party room at the museum, where refreshments will be served. We expect to be showing film clips from the halcyon days of the streetcars in Ithaca and on the Cornell campus.
