Mrs. Ladd was a breeder of chocolate Labrador retrievers and Arabian horses. Several of her Labrador retrievers earned their American Field Trial Grand Championships. Alumni and Cornell in Washington students will climb Old Rag Mountain, near Sperryville, VA, for the 52nd time in our semi-annual trek into the Blue Ridge. This is one of the Washington area's most popular excursions, and we expect a large turnout (25-40 people) each time we go.

The first 1/3 of the strenuous, 9-mile hike (summit 3,268 ft.; elevation gain 2,300 ft.) is on an uphill trail through the trees, while the upper part is open and rocky. Bring lunch and water in a day-pack, and be sure to wear a hat and sturdy shoes. The total time needed for climbing, enjoying the view, eating, and descending is about 6 hours. We usually get back to DC around 7:00 pm. The Park Service does not allow more hikers after the parking lot is full. Therefore, a prompt 8:00 am start from the Cornell Center is needed for this full-day event. (Note: this is a very difficult hike; those who have not hiked a trail like Old Rag's are strongly encouraged to e-mail or call Clint Brass, using the contact information below, if you would like to get more information before RSVPing.) To comply with University policy, participants will be asked to sign a standard release form.

From the Ground Up (FGU) is based at Clagett Farm in Upper Marlboro, MD. FGU is a collaborative effort between the Capital Area Food Bank and the Chesapeake Bay Foundation that promotes sustainable agriculture and food security in the metro area. A seasonal staff grows vegetables according to the principles of sustainable organic farming, which includes soil and water conservation and utilizing biological cycles and controls for pest and fertility management. Half of the vegetables grown at Clagett Farm are sold through an arrangement called Community Supported Agriculture (CSA), in which local customers receive a weekly "share" of fresh seasonal produce in exchange for payment at the beginning of the season. As part of the Capital Area Food Bank, From the Ground Up distributes nearly 50 percent of its produce to under-served communities within the Washington DC metropolitan area. From the Ground Up distributes Clagett farm produce to local nonprofit agencies serving low-income families and individuals.

Volunteers at the farm can expect to participate in a broad range of farming activities, including weeding and harvesting. No experience is necessary for field work. We will work from 9 am to 1 pm, and those who are interested can bring a picnic lunch to eat together on the farm afterward.

Dress code: Volunteers should plan on getting dirty during their visit to the farm and dress accordingly for the weather. Wear long pants and long-sleeved clothing for harvesting itchy crops. Any rugged shoes are fine. Wear a hat and sunscreen if it is going to be sunny. Bringing your own gloves, pocket knife and pruners can be helpful if you have them, but not necessary.

Lunch: Food will not be served, but there is a cooler if you want to bring your own picnic lunch.

Water: Bring a bottle of water! The farm has outdoor bathrooms, and they have plenty of clean well water to re-fill water bottles.

The Lost Dog & Cat Rescue Foundation (LDCRF) rescues abandoned or displaced dogs and cats from the threat of euthanasia in over-crowded shelters or other at-risk situations and places them for adoption into loving homes. It places about 2,000 dogs and cats each year into adoptive homes, for a total of more than 15,000 since 2001! All animals in the care of LDCRF are spayed or neutered and fully vaccinated prior to adoption and any special medical needs are addressed.

While most dogs and cats await adoption at the 61-acre Lost Dog & Cat Ranch in Sumerduck, Virginia, each weekend, an army of volunteers (YOU!) mobilizes to run eight adoption events in the Metro-DC area at PetSmart and PetCo stores. This entails walking the animals around the store, speaking to potential adopters and assisting them in the adoption process.
