A group of CCW members and guests arrived at the U.S. Botanic Garden Nov. 5 for a tour of the Conservatory, led by alumna Gladys Stifel '58. Not only did they experience the nine various plant houses in person, learning interesting facts about the foliage in each house, but they also got a sneak peek at the 12 models of National Mall buildings—made of all-natural materials—already in place for the annual Holiday Exhibition. The Seasons Greetings exhibit is open to the public, including the East Gallery featuring historic Presidents' homes and where creatures live as well as many models of moving trains. The building models were designed by Paul Buse, a renowned landscape architect whose work over some 30 years is seen annually in a number of cities, many of which feature miniature landmarks of the hosting city.

Not all who wished to take the November tour could be accommodated, so perhaps a weekend spring tour could be arranged. In the meantime, the holiday exhibition will run through Monday, January 2nd. The USBG is open from 10 am to 5 pm, 365 days of the year, including Christmas Day. There is no fee. Seven times during the exhibit, on Tuesday and Thursday evenings, there will be extended evening hours until 8 pm. The Garden Court where visitors enter will feature a huge decorated Douglas Fir, surrounded by models of existing historic Capitol Hill houses and a B & O passenger train circling the tree. The rest of the USBG is open to visitors as usual while the holiday exhibition is on display.


Washington DC currently has the highest rate of homelessness of any city in the country. In 2007, 11,762 people reported themselves as homeless. Of these individuals, it is estimated that children account for approximately 25 percent.

The Lost Dog & Cat Rescue Foundation (LDCRF) rescues abandoned or displaced dogs and cats from the threat of euthanasia in over-crowded shelters or other at-risk situations and places them for adoption into loving homes. It places about 2,000 dogs and cats each year into adoptive homes, for a total of more than 15,000 since 2001! All animals in the care of LDCRF are spayed or neutered and fully vaccinated prior to adoption and any special medical needs are addressed.

While most dogs and cats await adoption at the 61-acre Lost Dog & Cat Ranch in Sumerduck, Virginia, each weekend, an army of volunteers (YOU!) mobilizes to run eight adoption events in the Metro-DC area at PetSmart and PetCo stores. This entails walking the animals around the store, speaking to potential adopters and assisting them in the adoption process.
