The new CCW website goes live in December. Here's what you can expect:

• By mid-December, all information will be live on the new site. The web address will still be www.cornellclubdc.org.

• Site administrators will send you a message at the email address we have on file for you, inviting you to log in for the first time. When you do, you'll be asked to create a password. From then on, you'll be able to see and correct your membership information, and the site will remember it for event registrations and similar functions. The site will not store payment or credit card data. Please do not provide us any sensitive information, such as Social Security Numbers.

• If you don't receive that email, please check your Spam or Trash folder, just in case. If it's not there, then kindly contact one of the admin team (see box on right), and give us your name and the email address you'd like to use. We can then go into the system and set you up with the right email address so you can start the process. You won't need to log into the site to use it for things like reading news and information. When you do register for events, however, then you'll be asked for your email and password. If you forget your password, contact an admin.

CCW Moves to New Website

Many of us are used to the present CCW website, which has been in service for many years. Behind the scenes, though, our technology has needed to make a transition to keep up with today's transforming landscape. Our Board has also been changing as elected volunteers retire or move on to other duties. All of this means that even though we've kept our website and database easy for our members to use, the burden of time and effort to maintain them has been steadily increasing.

Over the past few months, the CCW Board has been evaluating different approaches to a solution and has decided on a package hosted by Wild Apricot, a company whose business is maintaining websites for non-profit organizations like ours. For the first time, the website you see and the database that keeps your records will be unified. For you, our members, the change should be pretty seamless. You'll gain the ability to manage your own membership data (for example, areas of interest, or changes of address). The website will look different, but it presents the same information.

This change has been a long time coming, and the Board spent a lot of effort cautiously selecting the best and most cost-efficient alternative for the club. Please let us know what you think of it. Post on our Facebook page and tell us what you like, what you don't, and by all means ask us any questions. We're looking forward to seeing you in 2013 and beyond!
