Opportunity Knocks: Help Wanted for Future Events

CCW is looking for volunteers to help research and organize the following future events:

New National Museum of African American History and Culture (NMAAHC)—Behind the Scenes. Shortly after President Obama and Smithsonian Secretary David Skorton open the NMAAHC in September 2016, CCW will be organizing its own special visit with a key staff member as docent in October 2016. This event will be in partnership with the Cornell Black Alumni Association.

Rally around the Marine Band on Sousa's Birthday. The United States Marine Band, residing in the neighborhood known to John Philip Sousa as "The Yards," traditionally offers a musical tribute to the "March King" at the Sousa family gravesite in Congressional Cemetery on his birthday. This year Sousa's birthday falls on Sunday, November 6th, two days before Election Day. Sousa was born in the same neighborhood and grew up in The Yards near the flourishing Barracks Row on Capital Hill. The new Commandant of the Marine Band is moving quickly to advance the Band's multi-year project of making Sousa's marches available for free online to the general public. Big Red Band alums, music majors, and fans of the Marines and the President's Own will be interested in this event.

New U.S. Diplomacy Center—Andrew Dickson White, Ambassador to Russia and Germany. Planned for many years and now under construction at the U.S. State Department, the U.S. Diplomacy Center will be more accessible to the general public, including school-age visitors, than the current museum inside the tight security arrangements at the State Department. Our CCW event will include presentations in the George C. Marshall Conference Center featuring Andrew Dickson White's diplomatic assignments to Czarist Russia in St. Petersburg and to Germany after Bismarck in Berlin. The U.S. Diplomacy Center will open in 2017, and our research has already begun. Historians, history buffs and Cornellians interested in international relations will enjoy working on this event.
