CCW History

With the March 2017 issue of CCW News, we began a series to honor CCW's 32 Past Presidents.

For many years, the Cornell Women's Club and the Cornell Club of Washington (men only) sponsored their own programs and activities. In December 1965, both boards approved a merger agreement, and a referendum vote was mailed to the alumni. The two presidents at the time, Edwin Miller '35 and Lori Eisenberg '50, completed their terms. For the following year (1966-67), Phillip Fleming '52 was elected the first president of the newly consolidated group.

Honoring CCW Past Presidents

Born in Cleveland, OH, Dale Lazar decided in the 8th grade that he was going to become an electrical engineer. With Cornell (of course) as his choice, AP credits allowed Dale to finish his undergraduate engineering math and science sequences early, so that by his 2nd semester sophomore year, he added courses in the fields of philosophy, psychology and government. "Constitutional Politics" with Professor David Danielski, in particular, caused Dale to wonder whether a career in law might supplant engineering. Completing his B.S. with distinction, Dale received his Cornell Law degree in 1977.

While an undergraduate, Dale was involved in the Big Red Band, playing trumpet, and his fraternity, Kappa Delta Rho, where he served terms as Executive VP and Member Recruitment Chair. One of Dale's favorite Cornell memories involved his time with the

Big Red Band (BRB). Dale marched for 4 years as an undergraduate. After he began law school, he no longer had time to practice his trumpet, but was kept on as a weekend BRB assistant manager. For bringing band equipment onto Schoellkopf Field, he gained free admission to football games. He also got to fire the BRB's cannon. Said cannon (shooting shotgun blanks, of course!) was fired every time CU scored a touchdown. One Saturday game, Dale fired the cannon as usual in response to a touchdown without seeing an Ithaca police officer standing just down range of the cannon. Goodbye cannon!

Luckily for CCW, a job immediately following his law degree brought Dale to Washington, DC, After volunteering a few years with the Cornell Alumni Admissions Ambassador Network (CAAAN), a CCW Board member asked Dale if he would consider joining our CCW Board. Upon learning CCW membership was a prerequisite, Dale joined CCW as he accepted the nomination. In addition to being President of CCW ('90-'92), he also served as Treasurer, Program VP and Scholarship VP. Dale was 1st VP for about a month when the active President announced that she would be relocated immediately from Washington. As a result, Dale stepped into the President position. Since the Club was in stellar operational order, Dale decided his guiding principle should be "don't screw it up!". As President of CCW, Dale, in his words, worked to more thoroughly establish CCW as "the umbrella Cornell organization in the DC area". He added Board members who were also officers of other CU organizations like CBAA, Cornell Hotelier Society and the Johnson Business School, and he encouraged cross-listing events. A reduction in dues was offered to individuals who were members of the several CU local alumni organizations to encourage the broadening and building of our local Cornell community. Remaining involved currently as a member of the CCW Scholarship Committee and Investment and Audit Committee, Dale also attends CCW events and Board meetings. He also serves as a co-Chair with Nicole Del Toro '91, leading the Regional Tower Club Annual Fund Committee. Dale believes enthusiastically and deeply that Cornell gave him so much more than he could ever give back, but he continues his quest. Salient enrichments offered by CCW that keep Dale returning are "fellowship and fun in 'hanging out' with CCW members and friends and that CCW provides easy opportunities to give back to Cornell." Likely this is true for many Cornellians, who feel that Cornell left them indebted for transformative life and academic experiences gained on the Hill above Cayuga Lake. He lives in McLean with his wife, Debbie, and has three adult children, Stephen, Kevin and Vanessa '09. If you haven't yet met Dale, introduce yourself and greet fellow Cornellians you meet along the way. You'll be glad you did.
