Honoring CCW Past President

Dr. A'ndrea Van Schoick, B.S. '96 Cornell Club President 2013-2015



In recognition of the 100th anniversary of the ratification of the 19th amendment and 150 years of women admitted to Cornell, CCW is honored to feature Past President Dr. A'ndrea Van Schoick. Dr. Van Schoick earned a BS with Honors in Animal Science from Cornell in 1996, followed by a BS (1998) and a DVM (2000) from the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, and holds several professional licenses and certifications. Currently, she is the Scientific Curriculum Director of the FDA Center for Veterinary Medicine, and is a veterinarian in a private companion animal clinical practice.

A'ndrea has maintained her connection with Cornell through class, regional, College, and University-wide groups. In addition to various roles held on the CCW Board, A'ndrea also served as a Past President of the CALS Alumni Association, Immediate Past President of the Cornell Class of 1996, current President of CACO and serves on the Cornell University Council Administrative Board and the Cornell Alumni Magazine Advisory Board. A'ndrea is active with CAAAN, the Continuous Reunion Club, and has served on a number of other Cornell committees.

The main goals of A'ndrea's CCW Presidency were to grow membership, increase scholarship funding for Cornell undergraduates, engage alumni through diverse programming, and increase the "Cornell footprint" locally and beyond. Among CCW's accomplishments during A'ndrea's tenure were achieving over 1,000 CCW members, awarding a total of \$6,000 in scholarships to 8 students, holding two CCW Scholarship Galas, cultivating growth of the Community Service program, and upgrading the CCW membership database and the online events platform. CCW celebrated Cornell's sesquicentennial with a variety of events, including a day-long narrated local bus tour highlighting Ezra Cornell's accomplishments and Washington's Animal Rescue League service events. Working alongside the Cornell Provost and College of Veterinary Medicine Dean, Dr. Michael Kotlikoff, and Dr. Elizabeth Berliner from Cornell's Maddie's Shelter Medicine Program, Club members cleaned the facility, donated over 400 pounds of pet care items, and visited with the resident animals.

During 2013-2015, CCW programming was very active, with over 200 original and collaborative annual events, ranging from cultural and athletic to academic panels and visits at the Supreme Court with Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg '54. The club also enjoyed interacting with three Cornell Presidents. President Hunter Rawlings and his wife, Elizabeth, served as the keynote speaker for the club's annual dinner and as honorary co-chair for the Third Celebration of Scholarship Gala. President David Skorton visited the Washington area and the National Museum of the Marine Corps in Quantico to honor CCW's Major Richard Gannon '95. Additionally, A'ndrea helped lay the groundwork for President Elizabeth Garrett to make DC the first stop on her international tour to visit with local Cornell alumni and share her vision for the future of the University.
