StayHomecoming & 24 Hour Zinck's

Faced with the continuing effect of COVID-19 on in-person meetings and social distancing requirements, CCW moved to all virtual programming last March hosted by CCW Board Director, Tony Chen, Eng '12. In addition to longtime programs like the CCW Book Club, new virtual programs emerged, including Solve a Crossword Together, Knit a Big Red Scarf and the Cornell Club Around the World Mixer. As Tony says, "Any person, any party!" On Saturday, March 21st, Tony began his first 2020 virtual event called Solve a Crossword Together. By utilizing the New York Times Saturday crossword puzzle and a shared Zoom screen,

this event continued every Saturday at 3pm since March, which has grown to more than 30 puzzles completed. It's an inspired mix of regulars and newbies, trying to solve the puzzle as fast as they can, and laughing all the while.

On Sunday May 17th, Tony launched the first Cornell Club Mixer (Virtual Happy Hour), which initially covered the Cornell Clubs in Washington DC, Kansas/Missouri, and New Jersey. With the cooperation of Cornell Alumni Affairs, it has expanded around the globe, with participants from all continents except Antarctica. CCW members shared Big Red Pride at StayHomecoming events including a live streamed interview with Dr. Anthony Fauci and tribute to Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg. In addition, this year's International Spirit of Zinck's Night truly was a 24 hour global event with CCW kicking off the celebration at midnight with a 4 hour Tony Chen CCW Presents Worldwide Mixer, followed later by Puzzles and a Happy Hour with Corey Earle. Tony says "that during this time of isolation and quarantine, we now have the opportunity to make friends with Cornellians from all around the globe." In the virtual mixers via Zoom, Tony creates breakout rooms centered around Cornell themes such as seasonal activities, Cornell traditions, food and how Cornell has changed over the years. Thus, everyone can meet each other in small settings, all the while reminiscing about Cornell. The Mixers are scheduled for an hour, but always run way over, because no one wants to stop the conversations. In fact, here is just a sampling of comments Tony has received:
