Honoring CCW Past President

Dr. Terrance Horner, B.S. '92, Ph.D.'98



This issue honors Terry Horner, who served as CCW President from 2017 to 2019, after two years as First Vice President under President Grace Jean '00 during CCW's 50th Anniversary and two years as Vice President for Membership under President A'ndrea Van Schoick '96. "CCW service is the very best proving ground for alumni leadership," according to Horner. "I'm particularly proud to have been a part of the CCW board's collective efforts to engage DC-area alumni in the mission of Cornell, including the

Cornell-in-Washington Program, and to mentor the next generation of alumni leaders."

Terry earned a B.S. with Honors Nutritional Science in 1992 from the College of Human Ecology and Ph.D. in Nutritional Sciences and Epidemiology in 1998 from Cornell's Graduate School. After moving to D.C., he held the Nutrition Policy Fellowship at the Center for Science in the Public Interest, where he came to value sound science in federal policymaking. Terry has made a career at the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO), which advises Congress to make government more efficient, effective, ethical, and equitable. His work spans science and technology, food safety, and environmental issues and has resulted in numerous benefits, including \$230 million in savings. His reports were cited in the Food Safety Modernization Act, which provided mandatory recall authority to the FDA. During the 112th Congress, Terry served as Senior Policy Advisor to the U.S. Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works, where he was responsible for environmental health issues, including adaption to climate change, reform of toxic chemicals regulation, and oversight of domestic nuclear safety. Dr. Horner is currently Director of GAO's Continuous Process Improvement Office, where he oversees initiatives to streamline business processes and improve technology systems.

Terry's vision and goals as CCW's president focused on continuing CCW's legacy of supporting students through scholarship and stipends, developing diverse young alumni leaders through board service, and engaging local alumni through partnerships with Cornell's Alumni Affairs office. Notable events included November 2017 at the National Museum of African American History & Culture with University President Martha E. Pollack; April 2018 at Cornell Tech on Roosevelt Island; May 2018 Annual Dinner with Cornell President Emeritus Hunter Rawlings III; December 2018 Holiday Party with Cornell's Associate Vice President for Alumni Affairs, Michelle Vaeth '98; January 2019 Glee Club Sesquicentennial Concert at Strathmore; and the May 2019 Annual Dinner with Margaret Weitekamp Ph.D. '01, Curator at the National Air and Space Museum. "CCW's success as a premier regional club was built by leadership from my predecessors and successors, sustained by dozens of board members with whom I served, secured by hundreds of dues-paying Annual and Life Members and our many generous scholarship donors, and expressed by a dizzying array of successful programs that showcased the talents and interests of our local alumni and Cornell students, faculty, and staff."
