CCW & Woks for Washington

Maryland natives, Grace Shi '19 and her sister Cathleen, launched Woks for Washington (WFW) in the summer of 2020 to service the DC Metro area's small Asian-American owned restaurants that have been financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The goal of WFW is to promote pan-Asian-American culture through its culinary traditions. Woks for Washington https://woksfor-washington.com/currently supports six (6) local area restaurants by conducting donations of purchased meals and distributing them to local hospitals, essential services and shelters.

The restaurant industry has suffered devastating impacts from a decline in customer traffic due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which may shutter many small local businesses permanently. For the Cornell Asian-American community the loss of these spaces is especially concerning not only because of the loss of income for families, but also for the loss of cultural community centers that are important for many Asian-American activities and events that help promote community and connectedness among alumni, including: professional development, social networking events, undergraduate activities, guest speakers and community service.

WFW prides itself on its Cornell roots and reflects the Cornell traditions that have played a huge role in shaping its programs and values. WFW's executive board is composed of 1st and 2nd generation Asian Americans, including five founding members (Grace Shi, Aditya Shukla, Catherine Wei, Kimberly Wong, Winnie Ho) from the Class of 2019. They are driven by a common commitment to public service and community engagement. It's not been easy, yet this team has persevered together, and learned how to adapt and grow to better serve the community by using their collective skills for financial planning and sustainability, marketing and brand building, partnership formation, and volunteer coordination.

The COVID-19 project continues to be a major success, resulting in the delivery of more than 1,858 meals to medical workers and needy community members, made possible by greater than \$28,000 in donations and numerous dedicated volunteers. Please consider volunteering at WFW to deliver meals or making a donation. WFW operates through a fiscal sponsorship with Players Philanthropy Fund, a Maryland Charitable Trust 501(C) (3), and contributions to WFW are tax-deductible.
