

Directions: DC Central Kitchen is located on the ground floor of the Federal City Shelter at 425 Second Street NW. The Federal City Shelter is a three story gray building on the southeast corner of Second and E Streets NW. Please note that the Central Kitchen cannot be entered from Second Street. The entrance to the Central Kitchen is at the back of this building, down the service road off of E Street NW and is marked by a large sign. It looks like a service/delivery entrance.

Parking: Parking at DC Central Kitchen is not available. Public transportation is recommended. Parking options include metered street parking, parking at Union Station and the parking garage off of First Street between D Street and E Street.

Metro: Judiciary Square (Red line). Exit onto Fourth Street NW, and turn around at the top of the escalator. Walk to E Street NW and take a right onto it. Stay on E Street, crossing 3rd St. and 2nd St. Turn right onto the service road, just behind the building.

Reception at the Embassy of The Republic of Macedonia

The Embassy of the Republic of Macedonia in Washington DC is located in the historic Sheridan-Kalorama Area in a building known as the Moses House.

It is the oldest free-standing building in the neighborhood, designed by one of the most famous architects of his time, Thomas Franklin Schneider in the Queen Anne style and built in 1893 for the residence of the family of W.H. Moses, owner of a renowned furniture and carpet store. In 1925 it was redesigned to its current neo-classical appearance.

The house at 2129 Wyoming Avenue is a symbol of a life and an era of Washington DC. This historic property began the transformation of Sheridan-Kalorama, from a rural forest to one of the elite residential areas of the U.S. Capital.

Moses House served as a French Embassy and Chancery from the 1940s until 1984. An interesting tale concerning this house is portrayed in Danielle Steel's bestseller Crossings concerning the pre-World War II events surrounding the French Ambassador who worked and resided here at the time.

After the French Embassy sold the property, it remained vacant and the building physically deteriorated thus losing its glory. This changed when the property was acquired by the Republic of Macedonia.

In 2004 the renovation project was initiated and the full glory of the building was revived on October 26, 2005 when it became the new home of the Embassy of the Republic of Macedonia in Washington D.C and a residence for the Ambassador.



CALS Honor for Joseph Manelski

Joseph Manelski, Cornell Class of 1956, has been honored as Alumnus of the Year by the Cornell College of Agriculture and Life Sciences (CALS) and the CALS Alumni Association. Joe and other awardees were honored at a banquet at the Statler Hotel on November 5th. Of more than 80,000 CALS alumni, only 209 have been so honored since 1977.



The winners represent a wide range of interests and accomplishments, and each has strong roots in the college. All have achieved success in business, professional or other vocational endeavors; shown leadership on behalf of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences and Cornell University; and made a significant contribution to the betterment of society through community service.

In addition to his financial support for Mann Library, Joe has demonstrated his loyalty to Cornell by hosting the Cornell University Glee Club in 2006 and 2010, and the Cornell Solar Decathlon teams of 2005, 2007, and 2009, at his home in McLean, VA. Joe, a Life Member of the Cornell Club of Washington., is also a co-founder of the Northern Virginia Cornell Lunch Group.
